## **EXAMINATION OVERVIEW**

**The written examination will be held at the offices of the Royal College of Dental Surgeons of Ontario, 6 Crescent Rd, 3<sup>rd</sup> Floor, Toronto ON M4W 1T1. The oral examination will be held in November on a date to be confirmed.**

Dress is casual and a continental breakfast will be provided at 8:00 a.m. during each session.

### **Parking and Public Transportation**

Public parking is available one block north at 920 Yonge Street. The parking lot can be entered either off Yonge or from behind the building on McMurrich Street. We strongly suggest using public transit. The College is conveniently located on the north/east corner of Crescent Road immediately opposite the Rosedale subway station and across the street from Ramsden Park.

### **Conflict of Interest**

The College is committed to avoid any real or perceived conflict of interest regarding examiners for the oral examination. Examiners are not allowed to serve if the candidate is a former resident, current co-worker, close personal friend or relative. Additionally, if the candidate feels that any examiner has a real or perceived conflict of interest, a new examiner will be appointed without prejudice to the candidate.

### **Re-Examination**

Candidates may retake each exam. Two additional attempts to pass the written exam and oral exam are permitted within two years total time frame following application. If the written examination is not successfully passed within three attempts, the candidate's application is void and he or she is not eligible for the oral examination.

A person who is unsuccessful in the written component and who applies and is eligible to retake that component shall pay an application fee of \$100 and the examination fee of \$1,600, which fee shall be paid at least 30 days before the expected date for the re-administration of that component.

A person who is unsuccessful in the oral component and who applies and is eligible to retake that component shall pay an application fee of \$100 and the examination fee of \$3,300, which fee shall be paid at least 90 days before the expected date for the re-administration of that component, unless otherwise agreed to by the Registrar.

A candidate is not eligible to take the examination if he or she has been unsuccessful on either the written or oral component on three or more occasions, until he or she successfully completes such additional education and/or training approved by a panel of the Registration Committee that may include the completion of a new approved specialty program.

### **Appeal Process**

Unsuccessful candidates who choose to appeal the results of an examination must submit their appeal in writing to the College within 30 days following notification of failure.

A person who applies to have the results of the written component of the examination rescored shall pay a fee of \$100.

A person who applies to have the results of the oral component of the examination reassessed shall pay a fee of \$700.
